Dress code earns praise for liberalism

Today's styles belong to today's youths and we are lucky that our faculty is not living in the past as far as dress codes are concerned. As a matter of fact, the student-faculty committee on dress policy has proven itself to be very liberal to what is to be permitted.

has proven itself to be very liberal in what is to be permitted.

Those who criticize the whole deal, from the actual regulations to the student-planned assemblies, are blind to what the alternatives could be. Many schools seek conformity as a means of discouraging unusual manner of dress, and so uniforms become the order of the day. Foundhing is regulated. so uniforms become the day. Everything is regulated, from the style of shoe and the length of the skirt for girls to dress pants, shirts and ties for the boys.

In contrast to this situation, keep

in mind our own faculty's revised code. There's just no comparison between the two systems. And which would you prefer, one which is strictly set up and enforced or our own fair and practical one?

The main stipulation is that, "Students are expected to dress in a neat manner for all classes and school functions." Culottes which have the appearance of looking like

school functions. Culotes which have the appearance of looking like a shirt are "in". Skirt lengths are a matter of taste, but the extreme or riduculous will be considered undesirable. Girls may not wear

undesirable. Girls may not wear jeans or walking shorts. Boys may wear wash pants or dress pants which are neat, clean and in good repair. Lettered tee shirts and white tee shirts of the undershirt kind are inappropriate


as are "unusual or extreme hair ar-rangements," Boys are to wear as are 'unusual or extreme nair ar-rangements." Boys are to wear socks at all times. "Boys are expect-ed to be clean shaven, neat and presentable and are not to wear numbered shirts, ragged or rever-sed sweatshirts, or dress shirtsworn outside the trousers.

Unfair? Silly? An infringement on personal rights? Hardly! The student-faculty stressed the point that manner of dress is a perpoint that manner of dress is a per-sonal responsibility, one which re-flects upon your school, your family and yourself. In our age of indi-vidualism and non-conformity, more freedoms mean more respon-sibilities. Are you up to the task? Can you prove yourselves to be the young adults the faculty believes you are?



LEHMAN SPRINTER STILL RUNNING

Jack Greenwald, Class of 45, runs the sprint events local and national competition. Running in 10 to 15 meets per year, Jack's season begins with an indoor meet at Baldwin Wallace College on the first Sunday in January. The National Masters Indoor Meet will be held the last weekend in February at Reno, Nevada. The summer nationals will be at Michigan University. The World Association of Veteran Athletes host this year will be Buffalo, New York. Jack has also qualified for the USNSO (Senior Olympics) in 1995. The Senior Olympics are held every two years and offer a multitude of events not present at regular track and field meets. This year it is San Antonio's turn to be visited by over 7000 competitors who must first qualify at the state level. The city of Medina and Discount Drug Mart hold an excellent all comers meet. Several Universities are the site of regional competitions Marshall University Huntington, West Virginia and North Carolina University at Raleigh, North Carolina. There are also meets in Cleveland, Columbus. Cincinnati and in neighboring

because of their great weight, it was felt that they posed a risk of serious injury to anyone around them. (People were in fact around them as evidenced by the graffiti.) Mr Watts felt that they should be removed and at first tried to donate them to the city park system, but the risk of injury would still have remained, so a crane was then hired at a cost of \$75.00 to haul them away. Although someone could have retrieved them for a lawn decoration, it is more likely that they were reduced to rubble, since they have not appeared in 41 years. LOOKING FOR OLD FOOTBALL FILMS.


