Our operating costs are approximately \$6,000 for a year and the major part of this cost is for publishing and mailing the *Journal*. Excess operating funds are then added to the Scholarship Fund at the end of each year. There are some alumni who always send a few extra dollars when they pay their dues. Then we have a few angels who donate generously to the Scholarship Fund without even being asked.

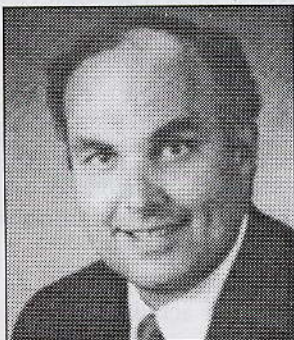

## SCHOLARSHIP REQUESTS

The deadline for applications for the scholarship fund is nearing and interested persons are urged not to delay sending a request for same, enclosing a stamped business size envelope for a quick return to: Lehman Scholarship Committee, P.O. Box 7498, Canton, Ohio 44705-7498.

Applicants must be lineal descendants of Lehman Alumni and the sponsor's dues must be paid up to date at the time of request. That is why it is important for members to keep their dues up to date.

As the *Journal* goes to press 39 application requests have been received and three have been returned completed.

Scholarships are awarded only twice to each qualifying applicant. This gives more students an opportunity. 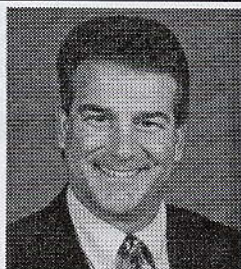
