

SCHOLARSHIP REQUESTS

The deadline for applications for the scholarship fund is nearing and interested persons are urged not to delay sending a request for same, enclosing a stamped business size envelope for a quick return to: Lehman Scholarship Committee, P.O. Box 7498, Canton, Ohio 44705-7498.

Applicants must be lineal descendants of Lehman Alumni and the sponsor's dues must be paid up to date at the time of request. That is why it is important for members to keep their dues up to date.

As the *Journal* goes to press 39 application requests have been received and three have been returned completed.

Scholarships are awarded only twice to each qualifying applicant. This gives more students an opportunity. Anyone who applied previously but did not receive one should apply again if the need is still there. Too often a request is turned down for dues not current or reference letters not returned on time. This is not the fault of the student or the Association, and they remain eligible to apply again.






USED BOOK FUND RAISER
