FIRST SCHOLARSHIPS


The Scholarship committee consisting of Chairman Tim Elder, and helpers Bev Smith and Wayne Arnold searched through applicants records to confirm they met requirements as set forth in the by-laws of the Association.

Each applicant was assigned a number with names known only to the Chairman in order to eliminate bias and start each applicant on an equal footing.

It was determined that eight of the applicants had met all of the requirements on their applications, and all eight received a grant ranging from \$250 to \$750.

Anyone desiring to apply for the 1996 grants should send in their request now. Students may apply each year, although they will not necessarily receive repeated grants each year. All applications will be reviewed on their own merit. It is stipulated that someone in the applicant's family must be a member of the association in order to receive a grant. They are given to Lehman H.S. graduates or the lineal descendants of Lehman graduates or attendees.

Newman, who, along with Renee Kauffmann, was voted class wit, has led a colorful life in California, where he became vice president of the Gene Autry owned Golden West Broadcasting. He now teaches at the College of Marin, where he encourages students to write about their lives. Examples of his work are being collected now for a book Newman is planning to publish. Each vignette focuses on a personal experience, and Newman says he has plenty of memories of Canton and its residents.

"Paul Hartung and Corky Milbrodt come to mind immediately. And George Sinclair, whose dad owned Meyers Lake," said Newman.

The Sinclair connection and the popularity of the park during their youth prompted reunion planners to focus on reminiscences about their experiences there. The party weekend began on a Friday night at Shady Hollow Country Club and the theme was Meyers Lake. Members rented the Laughing Lady and Esmeralda, the Fortune Teller, as well as a photo booth. The menu includes your choice of prime rib, fish, or chicken. \$29.00 per person covers everything, including tax, tip, favors, and door prize.



'66 WILDCATS REUNITE OVER OLD TIMES

CANTON — On Oct. 29, 1966, before more than 2,000 witnesses in Fawcett Stadium, Lehman High School placed a crown on the tresses of its new football homecoming queen, Kaye Carr.

Lehman's football team, meanwhile, got run over by a red-and-gray truck.

Entering the night with a 6-1 record, Lehman exited with a 22-0 loss to the Canton South Wildcats.

Things went so well so early that the Wildcats, eager to prove themselves one week after a 14-0 loss to Fairless, got downright cocky.

In the second quarter, South center Russ Neff broke huddle, arrived first at the line, and informed the Lehman defense where the next play was headed.

"What the heck you doing?" another Wildcat demanded of Neff.

"Don't worry about it," Neff shouted back. "They can't stop us."

He was right. Neff kept announcing the plays. At one point, Neff began to frame the news in the form of a conversation with teammate Pete Kimble.

"Hey, Pete, where we runnin' it this time?"

Such stories filled the night Saturday when members of the '66 South team gathered at Orlando's Crystal Light restaurant for a reunion.

The memories were so thick that closing time could not contain them.

The last of the old Wildcats, most of them around 47 years old, cleared out at 3 a.m. and headed to an all-night restaurant for breakfast.

The three 1966 captains — Randy Frederick, Kimble and Harold Adams — had huddled with Neff and Les Weaver and decided to give a reunion a try.

Even though this year isn't a milestone anniversary, they agreed it was time to get together with old pals, some of whom they hadn't seen since high school.

All but three 1966 seniors showed up, and they were joined by many juniors.

Head coach Larry Kelly and his '66 staff of Jim Swierczek, Bob Graham, Tim Miller and Dan Risaliti were there. They got a couple of surprises. First, they heard a few tales of escapades that had been player secrets until Saturday. Each coach also received an engraved putter.

Many of the ex-players still live in Stark County. Some traveled from afar; for example, Ron Hull, who was an All-Federal League end, came from St. Louis.

"It was quite a success," said Neff, who says he might try to help organize a Federal League reunion. "We should have done this a long time ago."

At one point, Kelly noticed that the Wildcat reunion hadn't broken down into cliques. It reminded him of the old days. It had been a team that did things together, he recalled.

The '66 Wildcats finished with a 6-4 record, including a 4-3 Federal League mark highlighted by a 16-14 win over Jackson that kept the '65 cham-

pion Polar Bears from repeating. Losses were to Louisville, Fairless, Central Catholic and a Glenwood team led by a lineman named Dan Dierdorf. Other wins were over St. Thomas Aquinas, Perry, Sandy Valley and Marlinton.

Kimble was a standout on offense and defense. In the Lehman game, played the eighth

week of the season, he moved from quarterback to halfback (Hull took over at QB) because he had three stove fingers.

"Hull did a good job against Lehman," coach Kelly said in a Repository article after the game. "Kimble is still the best quarterback in the county."

Kimble wound up making first-team, all-league honors as a defensive player. Other Wildcats named to the '66 first team were tackle Bob Moorehead and Hull. Honorable mention all-leaguers were Neff, the center; Adams, a tackle; Larry Watkins, a fullback, and Carl Hein, a halfback. Other '66 seniors

were guard Jim DeVaul, halfback Jeff Verheyen, end Bob Houmard, tackle Tom Passmore, guards Doug Peden and Phil Telaroli, and manager George Jones. Juniors earning letters were Mike Inman, Bob Ream, Roy McEndree, Weaver, Calvin Lake, Lonnie Flinn and Mike Watkins.

Many of them showed up Saturday ready to reminisce, almost looking ready to rumble with Lehman again.

"Everybody looked real good," Neff said. "Nobody was out of shape. We sure had a great time. They had to run us out of there."
