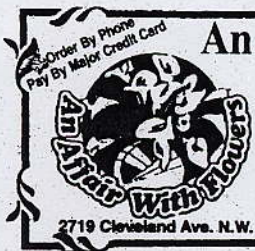
These, plus several honorary members, make up our roster.

Membership Benefits

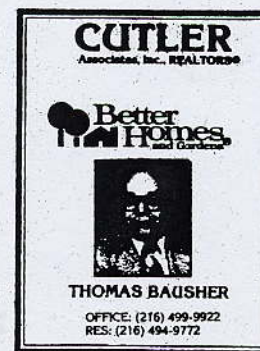
What do you get for your \$10.00 membership fee?
