Bill Wentz '56 is a nominee for the seventh class of inductees to be inducted into the Stark County High School Football Hall of Fame in 2008.



BIOGRAPHIES 2007 LEHMAN HIGH SCHOOL ALUMNI OF THE YEAR

KARL SHANK '41 - MILITARY

Karl was born in Frostburg, Maryland, and moved to Canton at an early age. He attended Woodland, Worley and Summit grade schools and then attended Lehman High School for grades eight through twelve, graduating in 1941. He was drafted into the Army in January 1943, and served 35 months in the infantry. While in the service, he was captured by the Germans and spent 127 days as a prisoner of war. During the 127 days, he was in five different prisoner of war camps, the last being in Moosburg, Germany, from which he was liberated on Easter Sunday, April 29, 1945. He was discharged from the service on December 27, 1945, at the age of 21. Following his military service, he was a letter carrier for the United States Postal Service, retiring in 1978.

In 1995, Karl and his wife, Helen, together with many other former prisoners of war and their spouses, retraced their steps of 1945 through Germany, arriving in Moosburg for the 50th anniversary celebration on April 29. The people of Moosburg served over 300 people a thank you dinner for what had taken place in 1945.

Karl has also been an extremely active member of the Alumni Association, always willing to pitch in wherever and whenever needed. He built the benches which the Association uses at the Stark County Fair. He always provided his truck for use in parades and at the Fair. He was elected as a Trustee on the Board of Directors in 2000 and served a full three year term as well as serving as acting Treasurer for a period in 2003. In recognition of this, he received the Distinguished Alumni Service to Alma Mater Award in 2004.

Barbara Smith's first appearance at the age of eight was at Timken High School when their School of Dance presented a yearly review. She sang and tap-danced to the song "I've Got Rhythm." That experience led to many performances as a young girl with the Canton Players Guild, one being Our Town by Thornton Wilder. She was on her way!

It was Ruth Cogan, choir director at Lehman, who recognized the potential of her mezzo soprano voice and cast Barbara in the musical The Desert Song by Sigmund Romberg. She then appeared in many other productions at Lehman. Following high school, Barbara attended Westminster Choir School in Princeton. New Jersey, where she received a Bachelor of Music Degree. She later received her Master's degree from this school.

After graduation, Barbara married Thomas Hilbish who was conductor of choirs at Princeton High School. They later

moved to Ann Arbor, Michigan, where Tom became Professor of Choral Conducting at the University of Michigan. While in Ann Arbor, Barbara became active in several choral groups, performing solo roles, including many in Gilbert and Sullivan operettas. She appeared in the role of the mother 33 times in 14 years in the opera *Amahl and the Night Visitors* by Gian Carlo Menotti

Barbara also accompanied Tom on trips with his choirs from the University of Michigan. While on one of these trips to China, Barbara was asked to teach a Master's class in Music. Highlights of her career came with solo appearances with the Philadelphia Orchestra, with Eugene Ormandy conducting, and with the Detroit Symphony, with Sixten Ehrling conducting. As a result of these performances, she has been honored with listings in Who's Who in American Women and The World Who's Who of Women.

Barbara gives credit to Ruth Cogan for her inspiration and encouragement through the years as well as to her warm family environment while growing up.


CLASS OF 1952 ATHLETIC TEAMS - ATHLETICS

In the fall of 1948 a group of boys from Avondale, Belle Stone, Edgefield, Plain Center, Woodland, Worley and Summit grade schools entered their freshman year at Lehman High School. Many of them didn't know or had never heard of one another. Little did this band of boys from all walks of life know that some day they would make athletic history at Lehman High School.

They were not exceptionally tall, strong or fast, but they were smart, and they embraced the team concept of athletics. Over four years, these 15 athletes developed their athletic skills and competed at the highest level.

In 1951, these 15 seniors were the backbone of the Lehman football team. As the season progressed it became apparent that this might be a pretty good team. Little did they know that by season's end they would win seven games and lose one, and for the first time in LHS history, the team won the City Football Championship.

Soon after the football season ended, seven of the senior football players became the nucleus of the basketball team. This record-setting team started off slowly – losing its first two games, however they soon began to jell and went on to win 18 games and lose five. In a game at Memorial Fieldhouse they set scoring records for Lehman and the Fieldhouse with 94 points. Later that year, playing in Akron, they again broke the school record scoring 95 points. The team went on to win the City Championship.



In the spring, five players from this senior group were instrumental in leading the baseball team to wins over McKinley, Timken and Lincoln to capture their third City Championship title during this school year.

It was an honor for this senior group of athletes to represent Lehman High School on the gridiron, basketball court and baseball field and to bring the school three City Championships. The 15 seniors in the class of 1952 were: Bob Arnold, Pete Campbell, Wes Hargraves, Dick Koons, Jack Meola and John Torok (football, basketball and baseball); Bob Fitz, Frank Moore and Dick Yant (football and basketball); Dick Fawcett, Jack Gissiner, Jim Merryman, Don Sue, Lou Weinman and Jim Westlake (football).

BILL LEMMON '55 - BUSINESS

William "Bill" Lemmon is a 1955 graduate of Lehman High School and received his Bachelor of Business Administration and Master of Business Administration degrees from the Ohio State University. He then spent the next 16 years in the Columbus area specializing in real estate appraisals. He returned to the Canton area in 1976 where he did appraisal work along with some land development.

In 1987 he founded and serves as President of Lemmon & Lemmon, Inc., a construction firm active in residential and commercial construction, including single family homes, condominiums, apartments, office building, senior housing, industrial buildings and retail centers.

He is also the President of Brookwood Management Company which manages more than one thousand apartments, retail centers and office buildings in Stark and Summit Counties. He has also been active in the development of numerous residential, commercial and mixed use developments totaling several thousand acres. He has been active in real estate development, construction, property management and real estate appraisal for more than forty years.


His memberships include the National Association of Homebuilders, the National Association of Realtors and the Appraisal Institute.

He taught at Ohio State for seven years, then at Georgia Tech for 25 years. After his retirement from Georgia Tech, he then taught part time at the University of Akron for five years. Specializing in automotive engineering, machine design and vehicular collision research, he has been a consultant to numerous companies and governmental agencies.

He continues to serve on several boards and committees of the Society of Automotive Engineers and previously was a member of the National Board of Directors of SAE and chairman of other boards of this organization.

OUT WEST WITH MUTCHMORE

Bill Mutchmore was the Biology and General Science teacher at Lehman High School in the 1930s and 1940s. He was famous at Lehman for the annual summer Western trips he took with a carload of sophomore boys. My brother Fred was two years older than I when he went with Mutchmore in 1938. He was delighted with the trip, and I was delighted that his going automatically qualified me for the trip when I became a sophomore.

Six of us made the six week Western trip in the summer of 1940: Earl Swallen, Bud Samuels, Jack Shortridge, one whose name I forget, Taylor, a boy from East Sparta, and me. Mr. M. did all the driving ... at exactly 40 mph. The car was a convertible sedan Lincoln, very old and very long. It was about a 1923 vintage with a long hood and a long body and a long trailer to carry our ten sleeping bags and luggage. The seats were leather and seated three boys in back, two in the middle jump seats and one in front. About every two hours we exchanged seats; Mutchmore knew how to eliminate potential preferential seating problems.

For fifteen and sixteen year olds this was a real adventure. We slept outdoors most nights in national parks, though in Los Angeles and San Francisco we did stay in motels. We ate mainly in park lodges and used their bathroom facilities. We went west on the Southern route and returned on the Northern route. The first few days and the last few days were mostly periods of long, long hours of driving.

Our exercise was primarily to hike the trails in national parks and visit notable landmarks, including Bryce, Zion, the north rim of the Grand Canyon, The Grand Tetons, Lake Tahoe, Mt. Rushmore, Lake Mead, Boulder Dam, Mesa Verde and the California redwood forests. We six mid-westerners had the chance to swim in the Pacific and in the Great Salt Lake.

I'm not the only one to admit that I've been talking about it ever since. To our young minds it seemed like we had had a lifetime of adventure and exotic sights and noble friendship packed into an all too brief six weeks.

She loved both jobs, but needed a little extra money to make ends meet. "I prayed and prayed about what I should do," Bernice said. "Then God made me a clown."

I laughed and waved and everyone had a ball." After she returned home, she noticed an advertisement in the newspaper about a Clown School at Walsh College. "I went and I was the oldest person in the room." She later signed up for a course in making balloon animals, and also attended classes sponsored by the North Canton Playhouse.

When it came time to pick a clown name, it wasn't a hard choice for Bernice. She had fond memories of entertaining her sisters' children when they were young.

"They couldn't say my name, so they just called me 'Anty Boom Boom.'"

Her first gig as "Anty Boom Boom" was at a Damon's Restaurant in New Philadelphia. Since then, she has appeared at many other locations, including Disney World's Magic Kingdom, the Hall of Fame Ribs Burnoff, North Canton's Main Street Festival, the Canton Civic Center, the Hall of Fame Parade and the Balloon Fest, and Belden Village Mall. Born in Detroit, Bernice moved to the Canton area at age 11. The Lehman High School graduate married Bill Wright and moved to North Canton in 1953. The couple had one son, William, before divorcing. When she married Dave Ritchie, she became step-mother to his three daughters, Randy, Tracey and Terri, and his son, Dave. Together, the Ritchies became parents to sons Andrew and Steve. She has 10 grandchildren and one on the way.

In 1965, the Ritchies started a business venture selling worms and bait out of their home. "When Andy was a baby, when he'd go to sleep, I'd go downstairs in the basement and count worms," Bernice remembered. The business soon outgrew their home and they opened Dave's Sports Barn on Main Street between Seventh and Ninth streets in North Canton. "We had the barn, and we lived in the home where Martin's Violin shop is now." She said the store carried fishing equipment, boats, hunting equipment and sports clothes until it closed approximately 15 years ago.


Bernice gravitates to children of all ages, saying, "You have to be young at heart to stay young." She continues to work as an usher at Hoover football games.


