
#### JESSE BARR






The days were just not long enough to do the things I would have liked to do. Midnight buffets were fabulous as well, but I never had room to take advantage of all the delicious food.

In the world of Girls Scouts, Arlene Bartlow has made a world of difference. The former Canton woman is the recipient of the Juliette Low World Friendship Medal from the National Board of the Girl Scouts of the USA.

The prestigious award, named for the woman who founded the Girl Scouts in 1912, recognizes Miss Bartlow's work as director of USA Girl Scouts Overseas.

Miss Bartlow developed Girl Scouting in the former UN Trust Territory of the Pacific, now the countries of Palau, Micronesia, the Marshall Islands and the US Commonwealth of the Northern Marianas.


#### NEWS FROM THE CLASS OF 1941
