LEHMAN GRAD COMES HOME


Dianne Talarico left the halls of Lehman in 1975 and has returned to become the new superintendent of Canton City Schools.

SCHOLARSHIP WINNERS

Although the board had planned to award 20 scholarships this year, only 15 applicants qualified.

Fifty-two applications were requested but only 22 were returned and only 15 met all of the requirements. Perhaps some of those will apply again next year and make sure they read the requirements and follow through on them.

One of the requirements is references from individuals such as an educator. Two years in a row students have lost awards because a required reference did not arrive or arrived too late.

Applications may be requested any time after January 1 and must be returned and postmarked no later than May 1.

It is recommended that next year applicants gather all of the required items and then forward them to the scholarship committee. Although the committee tries to advise an applicant when a portion of the requirements is missing, this is not always possible.

Applications are to be requested in writing and not over the telephone. The local newspaper rewrote the news release twice and each time made it sound like applications could be requested over the telephone. Written requests allow the committee member to pick the letter out of the post office box and place an application in the self-addressed stamped envelope that is to be included with the request and placed back in the mail quickly. Applications requested the day before the deadline undoubtedly will never make the deadline.

Sponsors/applicants – make sure your dues are paid early in the year so a student is not turned down for the lack of payment of dues. Keep in mind that anyone who graduated from Lehman and is continuing their education, although they may have been out of school for a while, as well as lineal descendants of graduates may apply for a scholarship.


SCHOLARSHIP RAFFLE TICKETS


