WHAT'S HAPPENING AT LEHMAN

Mr. Zettie Sims, the principal at Lehman Middle School, was the guest speaker at our May meeting. He usually brings us up to date on what is happening at the school at least once each year. This year he brought the plans for the new Middle School to the meeting to share with those who attended. There may be a new school named Lehman, but there will never be another Lehman as most of us remember.

He was so proud while telling us about the students who came back as the chess champions after competing over four days in Columbus with 65 other teams and then finished 11th in the nation and others who won photography awards and how Lehman 7th grade students were the highest in the city this year in writing and that they are gaining in math and science. He told how a team of photographers recently came to the school. They are making a film about Thurman Munson and wanted to photograph and see the school where his career started.

He explained that the neighborhood currently has drug houses and that it is not easy to try to stay ahead of the temptations for the students.

There are 700 students in Lehman and half are bussed to school at present. Forty students had perfect attendance this year and good attendance is one of the factors he and his staff try to encourage. Students get to take part in special trips at the end of the year, usually to Washington, D.C. Cincinnati was a three day trip this year for three bus loads of students and their chaperones. The Merit Roll has 190 names on it this year for students averaging 3.0 or better.

He told how random acts of kindness are still rewarded with hamburgers or similar treats from fast food places. It is when a student does something extra when they do not know anyone is watching that brings the extra recognition.

Excavation for the new two story building should start this summer or fall at the latest and then be completed in 2004.

It will be interesting to see what community project will take over the Lehman building. Keep tuned.
