### **CANTON LEHMAN HIGH SCHOOL UPDATE**

Plans are moving forward to use the Canton Lehman High School building as a medical clinic. The two-phase project, estimated at \$18 million, would create an estimated 50 full-time jobs initially. The plan is to move the existing Healing and Wellness Center to the former Lehman site. Dr. Bruce Hensley, of Mercy Medical Center's Work Health & Safety Services, and Rick Stewart will head the project.

In addition to the current Clinic's services, new services would include free dental and vision services, he said. Free meals would be served in the renovated cafeteria. Other medical services could be part of the Lehman plans. A second phase would include collaborating with area social service agencies to bring them to one location.

Government grants and funding are not being sought for the clinic project. They are looking mostly at private dollars and foundation money, things that don't have strings attached. They plan "gutting" the school and then recreating it just as it was during our school years. They have already lined up someone who will salvage everything inside Lehman and donate some of the funds back to the project. They are planning to add an elevator so everyone who got an "elevator pass" when they went to school can use it.

They are not looking for funds from the Alumni but would not refuse it. In their desire to recreate Lehman as it existed as a school, they are looking for help from the Alumni by providing as much information as possible about what Lehman looked like. For example, they are looking for information on the fountain area. Does the fountain exist? What did it look like? They plan on keeping the exterior of Lehman in its original condition.

During our Alumni Picnic on August 18, 2011, at Lake Cable Pavilion, Dr. Hensley and Rick Stewart will attend with drawings of their plans and to answer questions. That's an added incentive to attend the picnic. Remember, we provide the food. Just bring yourself and maybe a dessert.






### **CANTON LEHMAN WEBSITE**



### THREE DISTINGUISHED ALUMNI - THREE BASEBALL FIELDS Page 12

Canton Lehman High School over the years has had numerous Distinguished Graduates who have made a tremendous impact both nationally and internationally. This is true of many schools but there are few schools, if any, that can make the claim of having three baseball stadiums named after their graduates and each of those graduates played on the same Canton Lehman Baseball team of 1965.

That team had a record of 16-7 and had the following teammates: Tom Davis, Alex Garcia, Bob Kuehner, Lenny May, Ed Miller, Thurman Munson, Jerome Pruett, Dave Whitaker, Jim Albu, Jeff Barr, Gary Damis, John Fordas, Joe Gilhousen, John Haupt, Bob Johnston, Terry Rippl, Jeff Wade, Chuck Goodchild, Terry Rippl, Mike Barr, John Firestone, Howie Goodman, Marty Hoge, Rob Strouse. Managers were Phil Kiser and Joe Starkey. The Head coach was Don Eddins.

Of course everyone is familiar with the great Thurman Munson. Thurman was a 1965 graduate of Canton Lehman High School where he was captain of the football, baseball and basketball teams and was all-city and state in all three sports. Munson played halfback on the football squad, guard on the basketball squad, and mostly shortstop in baseball. Munson switched to catcher in his senior year in order to handle the pitching of his teammate, Jerome Pruett (a fifth round draft pick of the St. Louis Cardinals in 1965). He attracted scholarship offers from various colleges, opted to attend nearby Kent State University on scholarship, where he was a teammate of pitcher and broadcaster Steve Stone.

Munson was selected by the Yankees with the fourth overall pick in the 1968 Major League Baseball Draft, in his only full minor league season, he batted .301 with six home runs and 37 runs batted in for the Binghamton Triplets (1968). He was batting .363 for the Syracuse Chiefs in 1969 when he earned a promotion to the New York Yankees. Munson responded by batting .302 with seven home runs and 57 RBIs, and making 80 assists enroute to receiving the 1970 American League Rookie of the Year award. Munson received his first of seven All-Star nods in 1971.

For the start of the 1976 season, Munson was named the first Yankee team captain since Lou Gehrig retired in 1939. He responded by batting .302 with 17 home runs and 105 RBIs to receive the American League MVP Award and led the Yankees to their first World Series since 1964. He helped them become World Series champions in 1977 and 1978. He was an All-Star selection seven times. He won three Golden Glove awards. After his untimely death in an airplane accident, the New York Yankees retired his number 15.

In 1989 a baseball stadium was built in Canton for minor league baseball and was named the Thurman Munson Memorial Stadium.

Most local baseball fans recognized the achievement of Joe Gilhousen. Coach Joe Gilhousen is a 1966 graduate of Canton Lehman High School and a 1970 graduate of Kent State University, where he earned three varsity letters in baseball. Coach Gilhousen graduated from the University of Akron in 1975 with a Masters Degree in Secondary Education. Coach Gilhousen was the Head Baseball Coach at Oakwood and GlenOak High Schools, in the Plain Local School District, from 1973 to 2005. His overall record upon retiring from GlenOak was 575

wins and 305 losses. At the time of his retirement from GlenOak, he was the 7th winningest baseball coach in Ohio history. His teams at GlenOak won 17 Federal League Championships, 20 Sectional Championships. 10 District Championships, 3 Regional Championships, and 2 State Championships. Coach Gilhousen is a Past President of the Ohio High School Baseball Coaches Association, as well as being a Past President of the Stark County Coaches Association. He was named Stark County Coaches Association "Coach of the Year" in 1978, 1981, 1986, 1990, 1994, 1996 and 2001. He was named Federal League "Coach of the Year" in 1993, 1994, 1995, 1996, 1997, 2001 and 2005. He was named Ohio's Division 1 Baseball "Coach of the Year" in 1995 In 1982 and 1990 he coached in the OHSBCA All Ohio Series


Coach Gilhousen was inducted into the Ohio High School Baseball Coaches Hall of Fame in 1993 Crach Gilhousen has authored articles on baseball coaching that were published in the High School Baseball Quarterly and the American Baseball Coaches Association Coaching Digest Chach Gilhousen played class "A" baseball for 24 seasons, where he played on 10 championship teams, 17 All Star teams, and twice was voted Manager of the Year. He was inducted into the Stark County Amateur Baseball Hall of Fame in 1964 in addition, he was honored as an "Outstanding Alumnus" of Learnian High School in 2002, and was inducted into the Greater About Baseball Hall of Fame in 2007. Coach Gilhousen has also crached at Mount Union College for four seasons, and was the manager of the Stark County Terriers in the Great Lanes Summer Collegiate baseball league where his 2005 team war the league championship. In 2010, Joe became the Head Craen at the Massillon High School. This year he reached another milestone with his 600th high school baseball victor.

The Plain Local Schools named the Oten Dak baseball field Joe Gilhousen Field in 2007

The last but not least is an English Teacher, Baseball and Football coach and Athletic Director all tilled up into one -Lenny May, Coach Lenny May graduated from Canton Lehmar ... High School in 1965. He then graduated from Ohio University in 1969 and started his coaching career at Athens High School as an Assistant Varsity Football Crach. Head JV Football Coach and teacher of English. In 1971 he went to Chagrin Falls High School to teach English and to become the Head Baseball Coach at the age of 23. He coached baseball for 18 years. He also was the varsity football assistant for 20 years. He taught English for 32 years, serving as Department Chair for 20 years. In addition he was the Athletic Director for 20 years. Because of his coaching experience and his many years as Athletic Director, the Chagrin High School Baseball field was named the Lenny May Field in 2005

### DWIGHT ENOLD '57 WAS A FIXTURE AT CHICKEN MANOR

**Dwight Enold '57**, retired Chicken Manor kitchen manager who died recently at age 71, grumbled about his younger coworkers' contemporary hairstyles, offbeat habits and constant use of technological gadgets. On the surface, he appeared not to like the teenagers for whom an entry level job at the North Canton restaurant was akin to a rite of passage toward adulthood. Yet they seemed to love him.


"Dwight was a wonderful man." Pam Joy Sleighter said via a Facebook message. "He pretended to have such a tough exterior, but actually had such a caring heart once you got to know him! Every time Dwight would see me, he would always ask about how my family was doing and how my parents were doing.

"We called him 'Big Guy,' and he always had a nickname or two for many of us! My two sisters and I worked there, and he referred to me as the 'pretty one.' My other sister as the 'smart one' and my youngest sister as the 'princess.' He used to joke with us that, if we gave him a kiss on the cheek, was he 'going to get warts?'" Enold's daughter Gwen Goss said, "He nicknamed the ones he liked." He affectionately dubbed them with such monikers as "The Missing Link," "The Mouth" and "Plastic Tina." He kept his line of workers moving in the kitchen, while he cooked chicken, french fries, noodles and hot sauce according to the owners' specifications.

Enold always seemed to be keeping a few of his young helpers under his wing, sharing his expertise on food, occasionally covering for one who arrived at work with a hangover and frequently offering his advice on life.

The North Canton resident was born in Canton, the son of a general contractor who built the front portion of the Chicken Manor property in the 1950s. As a teenager, Enold took a job as dishwasher at the restaurant before graduating from Lehman High School. He was 19 when his father died, leaving him as the chief provider for his mother. That resulted in his repeatedly receiving deferments from the military draft until after his mother's death in 1964.

After that, Enold was drafted into the U.S. Army and became an aeronautics instructor — a peculiar job for someone who was not mechanically inclined, his family said. "In the Army,

he learned how to take apart jet engines and reassemble them," his daughter Valerie Wolford said. "He trained people to do it overseas. He never left the states."

Upon his discharge, Enold returned to Chicken Manor, where he worked until retiring last October.

"He was a simple guy," daughter Gwen Goss said. "He always wore a blue stocking cap he took from the lost-and-found at Chicken Manor in the '70s. He wore the same shirt in every picture. He didn't like change."

Enold met his wife, Deanna, on a blind date at a Marine Corps ball in the late 1960s. They were married April 18, 1970, but always celebrated the anniversary of the day they met.

For most of his married life, Enold worked at Chicken Manor from 7 a.m. to 9 p.m. five days a week. He spent his time off with his wife and two daughters.

He had favorite instructive sayings that he drilled into his daughters' brains with repetition. These include, "No one can ever take your education away," and "There are a lot of stupid people in the world; no one's any better than anybody else." In addition to his wife and two daughters, survivors include two grandchildren and a brother, Ernest "Teddy."
