



OPEN HOUSE AND DEDICATION OF NEW MIDDLE SCHOOL

OPEN HOUSE ...

Over sixty alumni had the opportunity to tour the new Lehman Middle School on September 22, 2004, at an evening open house sponsored by the Lehman High School Alumni Association and Mr. David McDermott, principal of Lehman Middle School, who conducted the tour.

Comments from the attendees were particularly complimentary of the gymnasium which far surpassed any dreams we had for a high school gymnasium let alone a Middle School. It is large and spacious. It doubled as an auditorium during the dedication of the new school (see below). There is also a small stage off the lunchroom for smaller gatherings.

It was interesting to see many of the items ranging from lunchroom tables to desks from the former school and many items still bearing the red and gray colors of earlier days. Red lockers prevail, and many designs along the walls carry the red and gray colors in ceramic tile. Carmichael greets visitors to the school, but could stand a little sprucing up, which the Alumni Association has offered to pay to have done.

Half of the classrooms are actually below the entrance level as the school is built on a hill with the resource center (we called it a library) also on the lower level. There is a small elevator just inside the entrance for those who may not be able to transverse the stairs from one level to the other, but based on our September 29 visit for the dedication of the new school when classes were in session, the vast majority of the students don't need it as they run up and down the stairs.

DEDICATION ...

On September 29, Association officers Claudia Selby, Jack Dillon, Nickie Wingert and Larry Taylor represented the Association at the dedication of the new Lehman Middle School. As part of the program, Association President Claudia Selby presented Mr. McDermott on behalf of the Association a plaque congratulating the staff and students on their new facility.

Also on the program, in addition to President Selby, were Nadine McIlwain, President of the Canton Board of Education; the Honorable Janet Weir Creighton, Mayor of the City of Canton; and Dianne Talarico '76, Superintendent of Canton City Schools.


