SUCCESSFUL RAFFLE OF HOG BENEFITS SCHOLARSHIP FUND

Alison was one of five 4-H members who had written a letter to the Hog Raffle Committee asking the committee to consider bidding on one of her hogs. The Kiko Auctioneering Team and a host of 4-H hog producers provided excellent insight concerning the bidding and how to identify a top quality hog with just enough leanness, muscle tone and fat to make excellent pork products.

Stay tuned for next year's raffle which hopefully will be at least as successful as this year's.

MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

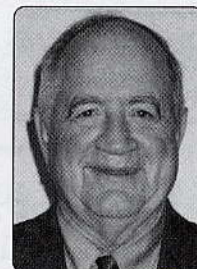
Greetings Fellow Alumni:

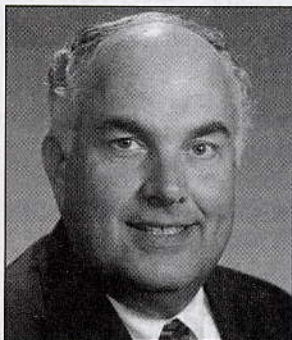

LETTERS ...

Local residents undoubtedly see the free newspaper *Senior Forum* at different locations, but for those outside the area, one of the writers is Elmer A. "Bill" Tilden, who currently lives in Sarasota, Florida. Someone gave him a copy of the *Journal*, and he has become a member. He was also sent past issues, and he wrote us a letter with the following comments:

Where in the world does the time go? I thoroughly enjoyed each and every page and my memory bank got jolted time after time. Thank you so very much. I consider myself a bonafide Lehmanite. My dad, Elmer Sr., was the manager of the company that built LHS. I was in the first sophomore class. My sister Doris T. Larson was in the class of '40, son Douglas A. Tilden, class of '62, and son Scott went one year ('61-'62) before we moved to Chicago.

Jack Bennett, another letter writer, wrote of the Lehman Polar Bears' finest hour:

In October of 1938, Wilbur Hanks led his teammates to a 20-13 win over one of Ohio's strongest schoolboy elevens, Columbus North. Lehman's team members included Lefty Uebing, Bill Ashton, Bob Bauer, Clyde Banks, Chuck Steineck, Jack Wallick, Bill Oyler, Bob Fuller, Don Elsaesser, Jean Clark, Claude Shriver, Penn Mack and Joe Boone. Columbus had been a leading contender for the state title, but Lehman took care of that when they beat them 20-13. Hanks was a one man show when the Polar Bears met the McKinley Bulldogs. Marion Motley had one of his finest days, but, time after time, the powerful Bulldog ace was brought down by Hanks. Despite losses to McKinley and Massillon, Lehman was one of the better schoolboy elevens in the state. There was no shame losing to McKinley or Paul Brown's Massillon Tigers.

Other players listed in the write-up were the Schreiber brothers, Pete Ballos, Jim Snyder, Hank Fawcett, Chet Fair, Jim Dorland, Don Schott, Jack Lothamer and Ray Sabin.

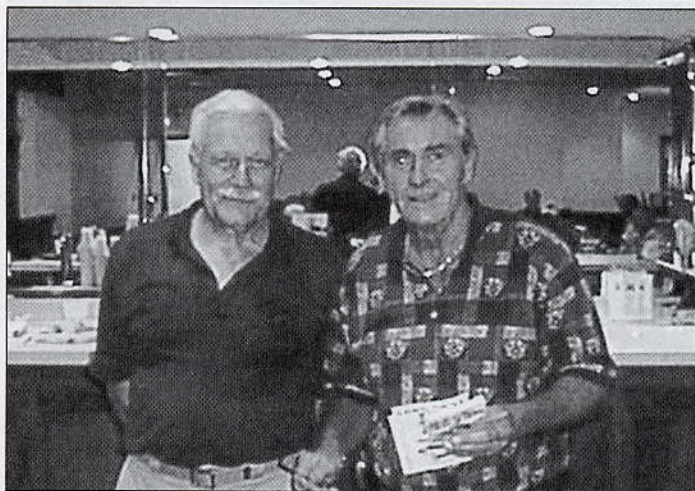

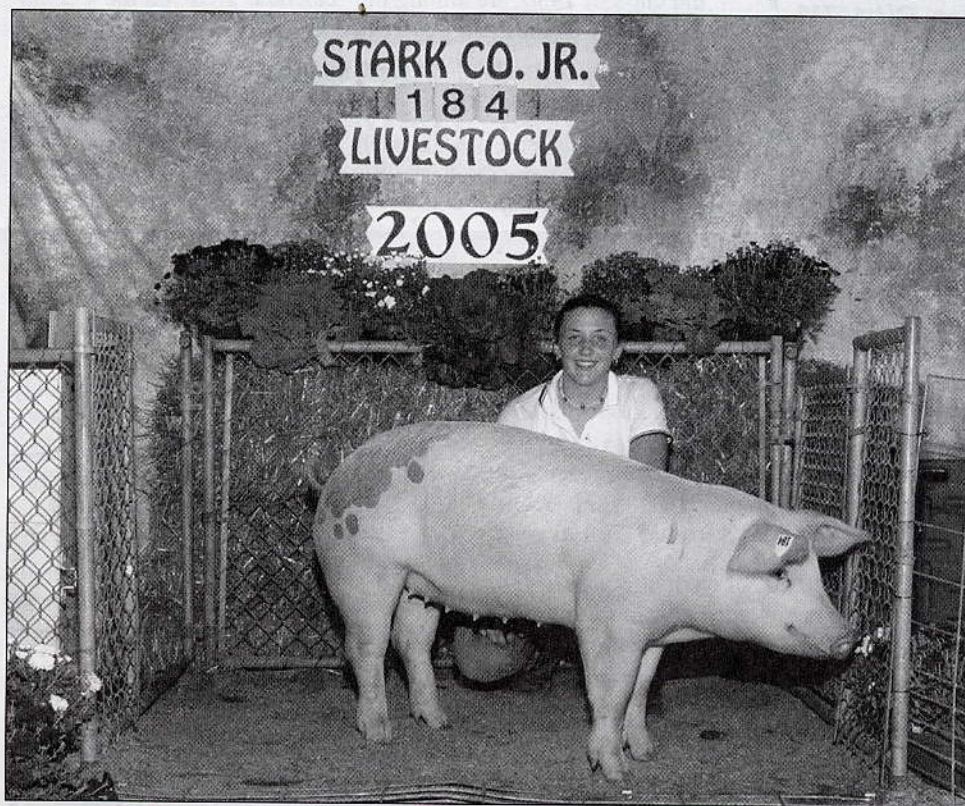
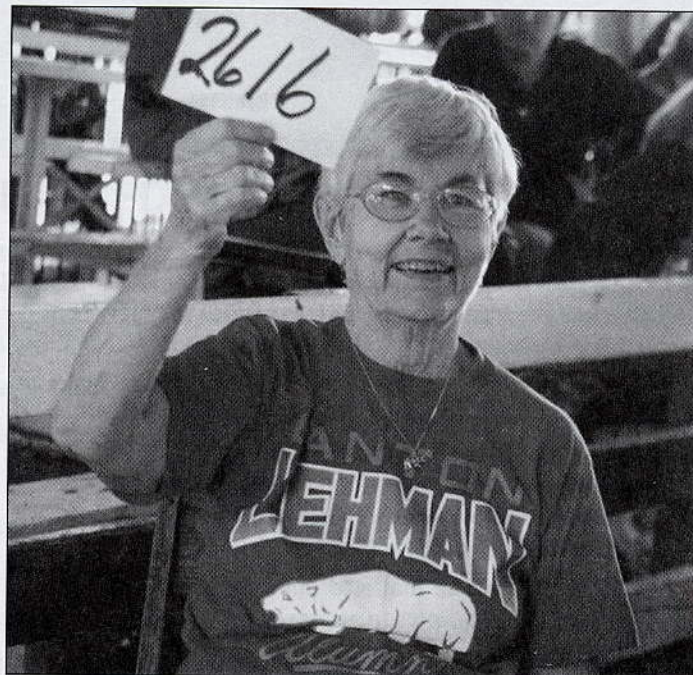


At right – Nickie Wingert '44 is shown making the winning bid for the 4-H hog raised by Alison Batdorff.
