



During our meeting, Irene asked where I went to high school and when I said, "I went to Lehman," she replied quickly, "So did I!" Then we began to compare notes (turns out she was at Lehman long after I graduated).



Following in his father's footsteps Bill still makes his "specials" from scratch every day while taking a few moments now and then to say hello to patrons.




For those who aren't aware of the program, each year members of 4-H clubs raise a farm animal as a project. These animals are then brought to the Fair and judged to see who gets the Championship Ribbon. Each animal is then auctioned and the 4-H members get the money. In the case of this year's auction, it was not a great year for the kids as there were lots of hogs to be auctioned. Many were sold below what it cost to raise the hog, not counting all the hard work. The Stark County Fair Board is very appreciative to all who bid because it increases the amount awarded the kids for their year-long work.


The auction was held on Saturday, September 2, 2006. Ed Moody, husband of past Alumni Association President Joanne Moody, who has attended many of these auctions, agreed to help walk me through the process. First we selected several hogs to bid on from the program provided by the Fair Board. When the auction began, each hog was presented with his or her 4-H member, and Kiko Auctions conducted the bidding. It took about six minutes for each hog. Ed had to sit with me from 12:30 to about 5:00 before we finally got our hog, which was raised by 4-H member Coleston King. During that time, we bid on several hogs, but the bidding ended higher than we had budgeted. That was OK as in bidding we helped to raise the price of that hog for the 4-H member. After our wirming bid, we then selected a processor for the hog, which was Kiko Meats of Minerva.

Kiko picked up the hog and took it to their processing plant. The winner of the Hog Raffle then had to call Kiko and tell them how to process the hog. It is cut and frozen for pick up by the winner.

On Monday evening, September 4, 2006, we conducted the drawing of the winning ticket at our booth. Stephanie Neal, the 4-H Outstanding Youth for 2006, drew the ticket from over 2000 tickets, with the winner being Mary Jo Robbins, Class of 1971.

Our congratulations to her, and thanks to all of the other alumni and friends who participated in the Raffle. Even though you may not have won this year's raffle, you can be assured that the 2007 scholarship awardees will be winners thanks to your participation.





BILL WENTZ FOR HALL OF FAME

Bill Wentz has been nominated for the Stark County Athletic Hall of Fame. For those not familiar with Bill's accomplishments, here is a brief resume. Bill Wentz, Class of 1956, had an outstanding career at Lehman High School. He earned varsity letters for three years in football, four years in baseball, two years in basketball and one year in track. In his senior year, his football team was not supposed to be very good as they had only three lettermen returning: Bill Wentz, George Stoffer and Dick Gelesky. Those three were named co-captains and led the team to Lehman's third undefeated record, 8-0, beating both Lincoln and Timken in the process. He received the *All Around Athlete* award in his senior year, having earned 10 varsity letters. He was selected to the All Greater Canton First Team and the All Stark County first team in 1954 and 1955. He was selected to the All Ohio third team in 1955 and played in the August 1956 North South Football All Star game in Canton

Bill then went to Ohio State on a football scholarship in 1956 where he played varsity football for four years. He was a member of the 1957 National Championship Team. Who can forget his 103-yard kickoff return in the 1960 Illinois game setting a Big Ten record? Bill was named to the 1960 Academic All Big Ten Team. Bill was also a regular outfielder on the Ohio State baseball team. During the summers he played in the Canton Class A baseball league and was enshrined in the 1996 class of the Stark County Baseball Hall of Fame.

Bill is very deserving of this honor and may be the only Lehman graduate to receive it since memories of Canton Lehman are fast fading with the years. 
