I wonder how many of you proud graduates of Lehman High School can remember the very large script "£" the Lehman band almost always made at the end of their half-time show at a football game. Probably the only ones who would not remember would be the football players as they were in the locker room listening to the sweet words of their coaches.

Well, I need to confess to you all that the big script "£" was not original with the Lehman band, for I had been the band director at Lake High School just before I came to Lehman, so it was used by the Lake band for two years (I think) before I came to Lehman. I thought why not, so I continued with a few improvements to use it, however, I believe it was done best by the "Lehmanites."

I served as the last high school band director Lehman High School had. I am not sure of this, but I think I was there longer than any of the former directors. I was there 16 years, and during those years I enjoyed the friendship of the administration and the rest of the staff, their willingness to work with me when we had a schedule conflict and to help me in any other way they could. I especially enjoyed working with the students in both band and orchestra. Yes, we were the only high school in the city to have an orchestra. Our Stage Band was second to none in the whole area. I inherited a very fine drum section when I came to Lehman; in fact five of those drummers made up a quintet that won excellent ratings at the state solo and ensemble every year,

Yes, my stay at Lehman High School is one that I will always remember with a smile on my face because it was a very enjoyable time of my life.

I still see former students and teachers who were there when I was, and we enjoy remembering some of the things that we did together.

It was a piece of cake, and you old "cake eaters" understand what I'm saying; I hated to see it end. I thank you all for the privilege.





A DARK DAY IN LEHMAN'S HISTORY

A recent visit by Steve Atkinson, class of '74, to the Lehman Alumni booth at the Stark County Fair, put into motion research into a tragic event that took place on Tuesday, October 6, 1936. Steve was able to give us detailed information about his father, William Atkinson, who was a member of the LHS varsity squad hit by lightning during their practice on a field near Worley School that fateful afternoon.

The bolt ripped into the huddle of players at the left of the circle where John Kline was standing. Witnesses said it appeared to travel around the end, stunning William Atkinson, William Miller and Charles Steineck before centering its force on captain Don Correll, killing him.

After receiving treatment at Mercy Hospital, Co-Captain Jack Chatterson said it had been raining about five minutes when lightning began to flash. "All of a sudden, everyone's hands flew into the air. We just fell to the ground. Many couldn't get up. Our legs went bad."

Coach Jim Robinson was knocked out. When he revived, some of the squad members who were standing some distance away were bending over him and some of the boys. "I looked around and most of the boys were on the ground, some still as

death, others writhing in pain. I tried to get up but fell back. I felt dizzy and faint and my left leg wouldn't work."


Automobiles nearby were used to take the injured to Mercy Hospital. Coach Robinson insisted that every boy be taken away before he would allow anyone to assist him. Ever after that, Jim Robinson wore a black tie with a white shirt in commemoration.

The funeral for Don was on Friday, the 9th, at First Christian Church. It was filled to capacity, as Rev. P. H. Welshimer officiated. Don's teammates were pallbearers. Burial was in Warstler Cemetery where 1,000 stood in the rain as young Don, 17, was laid to rest.

The 1938 Polaris held a handsome portrait of Don Correll, in memoriam, who would have been a member of the graduating class.

This marks the 72nd year of the day that will never be forgotten in the annals of Lehman High School history.

The Canton Repository accounts of October 6 and 7, 1936, are credited.


