
HILL GANG GOLF OUTING





Recently, a former Lehman graduate, John Costello '60, someone I had known since we were in grade school, passed away. Funny, it seems like only yesterday when we used to play baseball in a vacant lot, rode our bikes downtown, and spent so many hours together doing absolutely nothing. Even though the years have flown by, the memories remain so very current.

John's death was the fourth classmate, that we are aware of, to pass away in the same week. For those of us still living in Canton, we are well aware of the continuous decline in classmates from old LHS. For those of you living elsewhere, the *Journal* tries to keep you up to date.

Ironically, the same day that John was laid to rest the alumni picnic was held at Lake Cable. There were approximately 145 Lehmanites there, covering a very wide spectrum of graduating classes. Stories were exchanged between the oldest and the youngest of grads, but all sharing the common thread of their years at Lehman High School. Many who attended were there because they were attending one of the three reunions occurring that weekend. This was my very first picnic, and I'm sorry I didn't attend in the past. What a great event.

By now you are most likely wondering. "Where is he going with this?" Good question, and I'll try to get to the point.

Lehman High school graduated its first class in 1938 and its last class in 1976. In its 38 years of existence, over 7,000 young people walked its halls. We cheered on our sports teams, drank milk shakes at the PB, went to the dances and even learned a little. So many of our graduates went on to great careers and have contributed to the betterment of their communities. They have left their footprint in the history of the nation. We are proud to say "they went to the same high school I did." Much of their success can be attributed to their early education received at LHS.



Joe and his wife, April, live in Richmond, Virginia, where his medical practice is limited to cosmetic facial surgery.




THE GATE PROJECT ... AT FAWCETT STADIUM ... A LASTING TRIBUTE TO CANTON CITY SCHOOLS

The Canton City Schools last year launched a project whose goal is to immortalize the heritage of the past and present Canton City High Schools. They are going to erect new gate entrances at each gate at Fawcett Stadium. Each school has been designated one of the entrance gates. We have selected the north gate since it is the one to the north. It is the gate that looks directly at the Pro Football Hall of Fame. Each gate will have a large logo of its school's mascot which in our case will be a Polar Bear as shown at right.

The immediate entrance way will be paved in bricks or pavers (one of Stark County's largest past industries was brick manufacturing). A total of 450 brick sales are needed to complete the project which includes the gate entrance. Enough bricks sold in Phase One





This will be a continuing effort, and, as bricks are sold, the blank bricks will be removed and replaced by newly engraved bricks. Bricks are on sale with names of individuals or companies engraved in the brick. In order to fund the entire project, bricks and 8x8 pavers in red brick, limestone or granite are available for purchase. Individual bricks are available at a cost of \$50.00 per brick. Paver donor levels range from \$250 to \$1000. Bricks can be engraved with three lines of text fitting 14 characters across. Pavers can be engraved with six lines of text fitting 14 characters across OR you can choose to include a graphic on the paver – in that case, it will fit three lines of text with 14 characters across. The Paver Donor Levels: Silver, Red Brick, \$250; Gold, Limestone, \$500; Platinum, Granite, \$1000+.


