





PRE-LEHMAN HISTORY

The following is primarily an extract from a forthcoming history, and is principally about the events before Lehman became a high school in 1938. If you can provide any information, especially circa 1910 and after 1961, please contact me at twe1@alumni.cwru.edu, by mail at 9390 Columbus Rd NE, Louisville, OH 44641, or by phone at 330-875-2323 but be prepared to leave a message. In the latter part of the nineteenth century the site where our school would be was a field with trees on the hill, and was considered to be out in the country. In 1902 the ground was purchased by the Dunkards (aka German Baptists and Brethren) and a building was erected which was used as a college (correspondence school?) to train workers for their denomination.

In 1910, Young's Bible Class, named for Emanuel S. Young, occupied this hill which was bounded by Oxford and Arnold Avenues, and 14th and 15th Streets N.W. in Canton, Ohio; but, because of population increases and an overcrowded situation at Central High School, it became necessary to have a city school in this area. The Dunkards had decided to sell their college property; the land was purchased at a bargain price by the Board of Education for \$28,000. After remodeling, the yellow brick building received the name North High School, and was opened for school purposes in September, 1910. The building sat on the northeast corner of the block; the hill was famous for sled riding. "Old North" was a three year high school with all students spending their senior year downtown at "Old" Central High School. Beginning in 1919 all sophomores and juniors were sent to the newly opened McKinley High School and North High became a junior high. Lehman High School would be built on the site where "Old" North High School was located.

In addition to Principal I.W. Delp, teachers in 1919 at "Old" North included J.J. Hutchens, James A. Berry and William N. Carson. All of them were at Lehman in 1938 for the first high school graduating class. In practically all places, I. W. Delp is named with only his initials. From other sources, the initials stand for Irwin Warren.

In 1920 it was decided to erect a high school building because Central and North Highs were not large enough to take care of the large number of children. In order that school might continue, it was necessary to complete the building in two sections, as McKinley High School had been. The cornerstone for Lehman High School was laid in 1920. The cornerstone contained a parchment, sealed in a container, containing the names of all the North High pupils at that time, plus other data. The west wing was completed in 1921. When it was opened November 11, 1921, all students at North High moved into the completed wing, and the North High building was torn down to make room for the east wing of the new building, which was completed in 1923. The "old north hill" was replaced by the stadium. The completed building and stadium were dedicated November 21, 1923.

John H. Lehman Junior High School was named after John H. Lehman in honor of his untiring and unselfish efforts for the public school system. Mr. Lehman came to Canton from Lancaster, PA, in 1859. He was Canton's first superintendent of schools. He was also the author of the 3-volume A Standard History of Stark County, Ohio which is used extensively as a reference in writing many articles.

Lehman operated as a Junior High School from 1923-1932,

having classes from the 7th grade to the 9th grade. In 1932 the 10th grade was added. In 1936 the 11th grade was added; in 1937 the 12th grade was added, making Lehman the second full high school in Canton, Ohio. It was now a Class A high school fully accredited by the North Central Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools and also by the Ohio State Department of Education. In fall of 1937 there were classes from the 8th grade to 12th grade. The first graduating class from Lehman High School was on June 5, 1938, and consisted of 187 students. Its first open house was history-making, because approximately 1600 attended. Because of the large enrollment, 1040 pupils, it was impossible to have the entire student body in the auditorium at the same time, so assemblies were held in two sections.

The band was organized in 1936 with 32 members under the direction of Margaret Miller. In 1937 they had 60 members and new uniforms.

Tragedy struck the football team at practice on October 6, 1936, when a lightning strike killed co-captain Don Correll and injured 11 others including coach JR Robinson who was hospitalized. The team was in a huddle at the time. The City of Canton now has a park at this site; the identification sign is at 22nd St. and Roberts Ave. N.W. This is between Myrtle Ave. and Fulton Dr.

In 1936, when the 11th grade was added, Lehman played its first Class A football schedule. In 1937 the football team was undefeated; most of the players had been coached by Jim Robinson since the sixth grade.

As a junior high, the school newspaper was called the "Lehman Mirror," then the "Lehman Outpost."

Additional information for the general history is needed on the following topics.

The class ring was designed by a member of the first graduating class, Betty Ray. The ring was an attractive piece of gold jewelry. It had either a black onyx or a brown tiger-eyed stone (alternate stones were added in later years – ruby, pearl, etc.) The stone had the school's emblem, from above the entrance, a gold unicorn, on it. Below the unicorn were the small words in gold, "Canton Lehman." In later years, the unicorn was changed to a polar bear head. I am not a jewelry person; can someone verify that this is a correct description?

In the early part of 1938, the Old King Cole Company gave "Little Polaris" to the school as a mascot; he was a white paper-mache polar bear. More information is needed on Little Polaris.


Inside the main entrance of Lehman there was a beautiful fountain which incorporated the Tree of Knowledge along with many symbols. More information is needed about the meaning of the symbols at the fountain.

The acquisition and disposal of the discus thrower statue that was on the abutment at the west end of the concrete steps is of interest, but hard facts are unknown. There apparently was a similar statue at the east end, but I have found no photos showing it — help!

AS WE PREPARE FOR THE HOLIDAY SEASON

As we prepare for the Holiday Season, we must recall last November's "A Night to Remember" at the Palace Theater, where former Canton resident Ted Gup told of his Grandfather's gift to Cantonians. Days before the holiday in 1933, Sam Stone, a Jewish businessman in Canton who had known both failure and success, decided to give out \$5 gifts to 150 people who responded to his advertisement in *The Repository* and told him how they had been hit hard by the Depression.


Evidence of gifts was recovered when Stone's grandson, former Canton resident Ted Gup, found the letters in a family suitcase and recalled his grandfather's generosity in a book, A Secret Gift.

Interested readers were asked to submit letters describing their hardships to a benefactor calling himself Mr. B. Virdot. The author's grandfather, Sam Stone, was inspired to place this ad and assist his fellow Cantonians as they prepared for the cruelest Christmas most of them would ever witness.

Stone made up the name B. Virdot from letters in the names of his three daughters — Barbara, Virginia and Dorothy (known as Dotsy). Dorothy Stone Newman, Class of 1946, and Virginia Stone Sharpe, Class of 1947, were Canton Lehman High School graduates. Ted is the son of Virginia Stone Sharpe.

Moved by the tales of suffering and expressions of hope contained in the letters, which he discovered in a suitcase 75 years later, Ted Gup initially set out to unveil the lives behind them,





A number of Lehman Graduates attended last year's event and a number have bought the book A Secret Gift by Ted Gup. It is highly recommended by anyone who has read it and is available at the library and on the internet.

Ted Gup is the author of A Secret Gift (Penguin Press, 2010) and two previous books: Nation of Secrets: The Threat to Democracy and the American Way of Life (Doubleday, 2007), winner of the Goldsmith Book Prize from Harvard University's Kennedy School of Government, and the bestseller, The Book of Honor: Covert Lives And Classified Deaths At The CIA (Doubleday, 2000.) He is a former investigative reporter for The Washington Post where he worked under Bob Woodward. He later wrote for Time magazine covering Congress, the environment, and served as a Washington investigative correspondent.

Since 2009, he has been professor and chair of the journalism department at Emerson College in Boston. From 1999-2009 he was the Shirley Wormser Professor of Journalism at Case Western Reserve University. Gup has also taught at Georgetown, Johns Hopkins and the Chinese Academy of Social Sciences in Beijing.

Ted Gup was just awarded the 2011 Ohioana Award for non-fiction for his book "A Secret Gift: How One Man's Kindness – and a Trove of Letters – Revealed the Hidden History of the Great Depression." The award will be presented at a reception of the Ohioana Library in Columbus on October 14.


